**MINUTES**

Preset: Marc Chretien, Megan Dion, Tim Kachnovich, and Rodney Newman. Peter Castonguay arrived at 6:45 pm.

1. Approval of the minutes of May 4, 2015, meeting

A motion was made by Rod Newman to approve the minutes as written; second by Tim Kachnovich.  
Vote: unanimous.

2. Reports

- a. Highway Foreman

- The Waters Hill culvert has been replaced. Next, they will be working on a culvert down by Maple Lane.
- They are using a demo excavator. There was discussion around going to 10-hour days.
- There is a potential issue at garage with children playing on the sand pile and in the yard. Carrie has ordered signs the say "Danger: Restricted Area".
- The 2007 international needs to be sandblasted. Roger got a price from Howie's for \$1,200 for sand blasting and an additional \$600 for related welding.
- The old JCB loader arms will be scrapped when the price of metal goes back up.

- b. Treasurer Report

- The excise for May and is \$6,500 ahead of May last year. We are approximately \$20,000 away from meeting the projected revenue budget this year.
- We received payments for the bridge snow blowing from Livermore Falls and the school referendum vote from the school
- The fuel tax refund application is almost done and will be out by the end of the week
- The pre-audit is scheduled for June 22 and the audit is scheduled for the week of September 28
- Amy is preparing for fiscal end of year

- c. Administrative Report

- The Growsmart Maine Community information gathering meeting is this Wednesday at the Livermore Falls town office.
- There will be a barn raising event at the Norlands on May 30
- There was an invitation to the Tri-town Community Garden dedication ceremony
- The town has been requested to sponsor an event at LES, however, this is not in the budget
- River Road bids are due May 29 with opening on June 1 at the next meeting
- DOT trash from Livermore Roads will be accepted at the transfer station

3. Old business

- a. Transfer Station:

- Mark Dubord was present and reported that he measured the distance to be 671' from transformer to the panel; 396' from panel to transformer. He stated that the CMP maximum distance is 220'.
- Mark did not feel comfortable hooking up first compactor. He stated he would not do second without better electrical service.
- The pole locations are marked and the service will be less than 100' from panel
- Carrie will look at Transfer Station and Building Maintenance budget for money that may be available

A motion was made by Rod Newman to have CMP install poles and the associated overhead line; second by Tim Kachnovich. Vote: unanimous

- Megan asked how much work was needed to prepare the ground for installation of the cement pad.

##### a. Town Report Dedication:

A motion was made by Tim Kachnovich to amend the agenda and do the dedication first; second by Megan Dion. Vote: unanimous.
